Bolton Valley Community Water & Sewer

Department Sets Meeting June 14 at 6 p.m.

Bolton Valley Community Water and Sewer, LLC filed revised tariffs with the Vermont Public Utility Commission reflecting a request for an overall 94% immediate and temporary rate increase, and a 94% permanent rate increase in water rates. The Commission has opened Case No. 18-0726-INV to determine if the utility's rate request is just and reasonable. The Commission set a temporary rate increase of 46% effective June 1, 2018. The decision on the permanent increase will be made by the Commission in August 2018.

The Department of Public Service is a party to the proceeding and is now actively reviewing the utility's records and forecasts to determine whether the utility's proposed rate increase is appropriate based on the costs associated with operating the system. The expenses reviewed by the Department's experts include replacement and repair of system equipment, engineering and administrative costs.

The Public Utility Commission has authority to set rates for water service; the Commission does not have authority over sewer rates. However, the Department and the Commission do look at the allocation of costs between the two services to ensure that the allocations are appropriate.

There will be further investigation and proceedings over the next several months related to the permanent rate request. The Department of Public Service encourages ratepayers to follow the proceeding on the Commission website.
