Green Mountain Power Rate Case Number 17-3112-INV

Department Seeks Public Comments Regarding Green Mountain Power Proposed Rate Increase

The Department encourages public participation in rate cases. Green Mountain Power recently filed a traditional rate case with the Public Utility Commission (PUC) requesting consideration of an increase of 4.98% citing rising transmission rates, regional capacity costs and net metering as the major drivers of the proposed rate increase. If approved, a rate change will go into effect on or after January 1, 2018. We want to hear your opinions about this rate case. Your comments will help us better understand and represent the public in this case.

The Commission has opened Case Number 17-3112-INV to determine if the utility's rate request is just and reasonable. The Public Service Department is a party to the proceeding and is now actively reviewing the utility's records and forecasts.
