Department Seeks Public Comments Regarding Green Mountain Power's Rate Design

On August 3, 2018, Green Mountain Power Corporation (GMP) filed revised tariffs with the Vermont Public Utility Commission (Commission) that reflect changes to their rate design which may take effect as early as January 1, 2019. The proposed rate changes are designed to be revenue-neutral, and to reflect the results of the embedded cost-of-service study filed with the PUC, which recommends a reallocation of less than 4% of GMP's total revenue collection.

The Department of Public Service is a party to GMP's proceeding and is now actively reviewing records and filing materials to determine whether GMP's proposed rate increase is just and reasonable.

There will be further investigation and proceedings over the next several months related to the proposed re-design of GMP's rates. The Department of Public Service encourages ratepayers to follow the case on the PUC website.
