

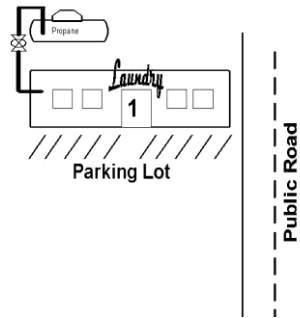
GUIDANCE TO IDENTIFY JURISDICTIONAL PROPANE PIPELINE SYSTEMS

Public Place

From OPS interpretation of 49CFR192.1:

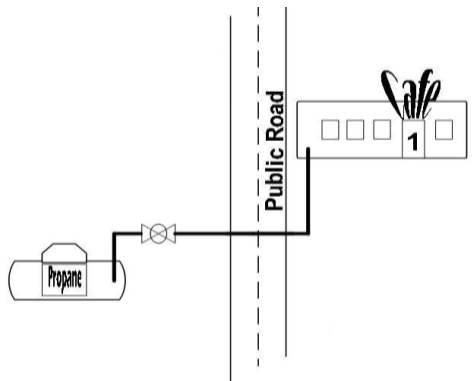
“...means a place which is generally open to all persons in a community as opposed to being restricted to specific persons. We (OPS) consider churches, schools and commercial buildings as well as publicly owned right-of-way or property which is frequented by persons to be public places...”

NON JURISDICTIONAL SYSTEM



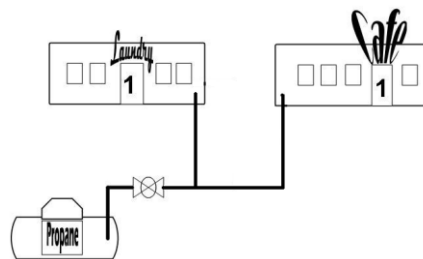
Single customer with system entirely on private property

JURISDICTIONAL SYSTEM



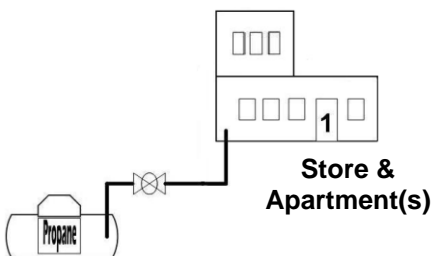
Portion of System in “public place” and System is not exclusively on customer premises.

JURISDICTIONAL SYSTEM



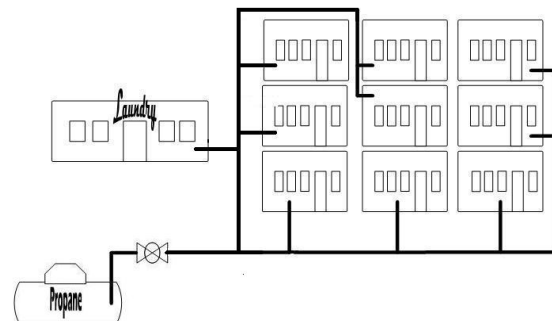
System serves more than one premise / public place customer.

JURISDICTIONAL SYSTEM



System serves a public place customer and one (or more) other premise. This other premise may be attached to the public place or it may be separate.

JURISDICTIONAL SYSTEM



System with 10 or more customers. (all premises may be private)
System may be one “account” or “business customer”, but is jurisdictional because 10 or more ultimate consumers are supplied.
